State of the Art

The current crisis has indirectly contributed to questioning the efficiency of financial markets and democratic institutions at European and national levels. Recent data from the Eurobarometer (July 2013) shows a continuous **decrease in the trust levels** that citizens from the European Union have on national governments and parliaments, radically decreasing in more than 25 points in the last six years (European Commission, 2013). **This situation is jeopardizing the European project** while at the same time a lively public debate about the meaning of European identity is taking place across Europe. Several **social scientists** have argued that the social and economic inequalities in the new global order are contributing to **civil social reactions, based on solidarity, aiming to achieve a better society for all** (Touraine, 2007; Wright, 2010).

Aims and scope

This project aims to **analyzing in depth the acts of solidarity** which are being developed across Europe, **the extent to which they respond to dialogic and inclusive processes**, the related **outcomes and the policy developments**. The project starts from previous findings on **successful actions which are combating the crisis** – e.g. by creating employment or improving access to health – **through acts of solidarity**. These acts are thus contributing to construct more inclusive and prosperous societies, by influencing at the macro-level (social inequalities) and micro-level (psychological wellbeing). In this regard, the **research will identify common elements** among these acts in order to examine their **transferability to different contexts**. To cover this objective, effects of these actions in **five social areas** will be studied in depth: **housing, education, employment, civic engagement and health**.

► Work Programme



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Scope: The research to address this challenge should in particular focus on the following key dimensions (proposals do not need to cover all dimensions and may include additional aspects which are relevant to the specific challenge):

- 1) Individual reactions to the crisis and challenges to European solidarity
- 2) Unity in diversity: prospects of a European identity and public sphere
- 3) Innovative social investment approaches for the modernisation of social policies and services

Expected Impact: Research projects under this topic are expected to contribute to enhancing European society's resilience by identifying common ground which may serve as a facilitator for a renewed resolve to foster European integration.

In particular, research is envisaged to expand and deepen the knowledge base on the discontent expressed by individuals in modern societies and on the ways in which their sense of identity is shaped. It should help to point to the cultural shifts that combine social and psychological transformations which would be necessary in order to address the deepest manifestations of crisis in Europe. Research is also expected to support European efforts to enhance a sense of solidarity among citizens. It will also contribute to debates on policy initiatives aimed at strengthening the public sphere to allow for more open and more rigorous debate on European topics within national media.

Multidisciplinary research under this topic is also expected to identify the potential for innovative ways of implementing and financing social welfare systems, including through third and private sector contributions complementing public investments in this area and take into account social rights aspects. The envisaged research is expected to contribute to the effective implementation of the Social Investment Package's priorities in general and to the building of the future knowledge bank on social policies in particular.

Proposals should involve relevant stakeholders with a view to integrating their insights into both the empirical and theoretical inquiry and to establish a dialogue on the issues covered by this topic.

The new cabinet in Japan is planning to substantially reduce the budget of the Global Centers of Excellence (COE) Program. The purpose of the program is to foster excellent research/education centers in Japan so that they could be competitive in the international arena and create excellent junior scholars active in the world. There are fourteen COE centers in social science, and all of them are under the risk of a 33% budget reduction.

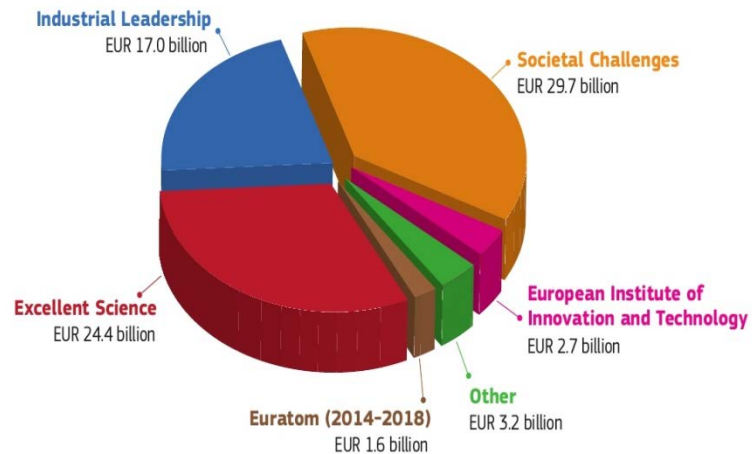

What do scientists do for society? Some researchers may resent the increasing calls for them to demonstrate 'impact', but my time seconded to the UK Food Standards Agency as chief scientific adviser has convinced me that such pressure will only increase. Policymakers are no longer willing to hand over billions of pounds of taxpayers' money to scientists in exchange for a vague promise that something good will come from it.

What politicians and society expect from science is changing rapidly, and science must change with it, or risk losing public support. Academics and leaders of the scientific community must realize that the system is failing to prepare researchers to meet wider society's requirements.

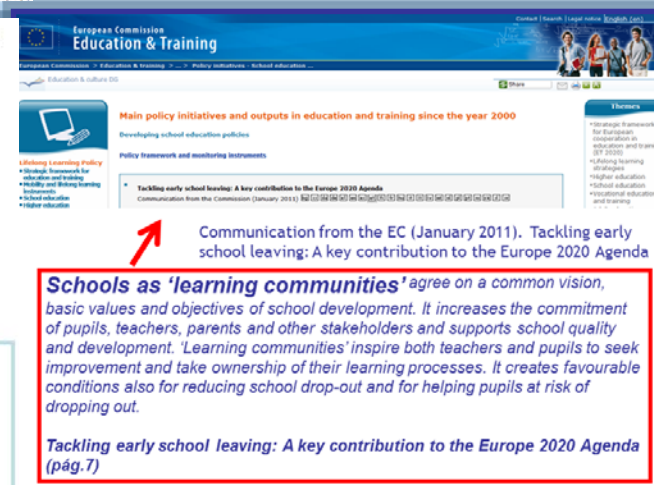



Council conclusions on the social dimension of education and training

3013th EDUCATION, YOUTH AND CULTURE Council meeting
Brussels, 11 May 2010

The Council adopted the following conclusions:

- Promote successful inclusive education approaches for all pupils, including those with special needs, by making schools learning communities in which a sense of inclusion and mutual support is nurtured and in which the talents of all pupils are recognised. Monitor the impact of such approaches, in particular with a view to raising access and graduation rates of learners with special needs at all levels of the education system.

Strict control of agricultural products after nuclear disaster. Decontamination with agricultural procedures.

The proportion of rice with radiocesium concentrations dropped significantly from 2011 to 2013

Evidence:

The contamination decreased after the inspection of radiocesium concentration levels in rice, using custom-made belt conveyor testers, within the prefecture compared to other agricultural products, since rice is the main staple food of the Japanese diet. The proportion of rice with radiocesium concentrations exceeding 100 Bq/kg was 0.8% in 2011 and dropped to a mere 0.0007% (71 bags out of the total 10,338,000) and 0.0003% (28 bags out of the total 11,001,000) in 2012 and in 2013, respectively.

Home-Based Workers

Evidence:

One of the intended results of the project was the improved legal status of informal workers in Thailand. HomeNet Thailand successfully campaigned for the enactment of a national law protecting homeworkers, ratified in 2010. The law provides for protection of wages – including equal pay for men and women doing the same job – as well as occupational health and safety and responsibilities of employers toward homeworkers. It also establishes a Committee for the Protection of Homeworkers on which both men and women will serve, ensuring women have a role in decision making. Between 500,000 and 2 million workers are affected by this legislation.
